Course description	<p>The course covers the basic concepts of real image. In the subject, the main attention is paid to the study of issues such as the characteristics of the perception of the three-dimensional space of the object and the principles of its transfer to a flat sheet, the perception of individual images. At the same time, it defines the rules of classical academic drawing: the correct depiction of any object (animate or inanimate).</p>	
Course objectives	<p>The purpose of the subject is the correct placement of the drawing on the paper; express the structure and plasticity of the form in the drawing; consciously describe form in space; constructive and schematic laws; to the laws of light-shadow and tonal resolution; to the laws of perspective; emphasize the psychological aspects and reveal them clearly and depict them in accordance with all the laws of painting; attention should be paid to increasing the expressive power of the painting and bringing it to a perfect result.</p>

The procedure for completing the subject.

The student's knowledge is evaluated with a maximum of 100 points. An overall success rate of and above is complete the course. A student with a deficit can take this subject again in the next semester or the next year.
