Course objectives	The objective of the course is to introduce the nature of the public sector, specifics of the functioning of this part of the economy, it’s comparative analysis over the private sector. It covers public economy itself, budgetary process, key areas for government expenditures, such as education, public health, social insurance and security, welfare programs, etc.		
Course outline	In the first part of the course, students focus on understanding nature of public sector versus private one. They will deep dive into specifics of government intervention in the economy, welfare economy specifics, peculiarity of public goods versus private goods. In the second part students study the key components of public finance, such as education, social insurance, social security, social welfare, public budget and taxation. Public economics, Welfare economics, Public Budget, Education, Public Health, Taxation, etc.		
Learning outcomes	At the end of the course, students should have clear understanding to analyse the government intervention into economy, specifics of public sector and welfare economy. Students can clearly identify policy aspect of the public sector, the key role of the government to design the proper economic policy. Students also can understand the nature of different public segments, such as education, public health, social insurance, social security, etc., implement their knowledge in the practice by critical assessment of the government policy in these areas.		
Policy	Written assignment: Students are obliged to prepare written papers focusing on difference case studies, which will be realized individually by each of them. Presentation: Students will be divided into small groups (up to 5) to prepare group presentation, dedicated concrete challenging problems of regulation. After successful presentations, each group will have a gained score, which can be difference depending on each student's contribution to the group work. Class attendance: Students scores in this case will be deducted proportionally to their absence during the semester. Quiz: There will be four quizzes and these quizzes will constitute 10 percent of the total grade. Makeup quizzes will not be given except in the case of dire emergency. Students are required to turn in answers to assignments at the beginning of the		

		classes at which they are due. Late assignments will not be accepted. All quizzes will consist of both open-ended and multiple-choice questions. 80% of questions in all quizzes will be open ended, 20% will be multiple-choice questions.
