The course project is designed in a way that it offers students to apply the learned concepts of the process of development of economic thought from the Antiquity till the second half of the 20th century by preparing a report. Small research groups of students that will prepare reports will consist of 2 - 5 students depending on class size. The students will choose a research topic based on their field of interest. The must include the following sections: introduction, literature/literature review, methodology, results, and discussion and conclusion. The students will submit the report using e-mail one week before the final presentation. Group presentations that are based on reports will be made in the last class. The duration of the presentation will be around 15 minutes.
