Assessment/ Policy	<p>Speaking examination gives instructors an opportunity to diagnose any major mistakes made by students in verbal language. The exam is held at the end of the course before final examination. Face-to face interaction in oral language enables students to review the material covered during the course; build confidence to think and respond quickly; apply required vocabulary; encourage further oral proficiency; take part in the constructive exchange of ideas; communicate with two or more people on different topics. If successfully students will be able to get maximal 10 points.</p> <p>Presentation/Project. Students choose one of the topics which they covered during the term and prepare a report and a PPT about that topic which will be presented in front of the class at the end of the term. They get 10 points.</p> <p>Class participation and activity. The students are expected to contribute to discussions in each class and to do all home assignments given by the instructor and exercises from their student's book and workbook on time. They can get maximal 10 points.</p> <p>All above mentioned makes 30 points maximal. The rest 70 points students can get at midterm and final exams. (35 points at each respectively)</p>
