Course outline	<p>Starting from the psychological aspect of addiction, since man is a social being, when we scientifically examine human psychology, we come to the conclusion that chemical substances that change people's spiritual life or other addictive elements produce different results in the psyche of each person.</p> <p>From a psychological point of view, addiction gives people pleasure at first, but these momentary pleasures gradually lead to mental disorders, causing the will to go out of control and the mind to become inactive.</p>		

Course aims	The main goal of this course is to provide students with knowledge about the psychological nature, types, and degrees of addiction, the effects of psychoactive substances on the central nervous system, the effects of different substances on the human psyche, and the tests used in the psychodiagnostics of personality disorders and psychopathological disorders in behavior and psyche.	
Learning Outcomes	At the end of the course, students will be able to: 1. Will be able to explain the essence and importance of the concept of addiction psychology, 2. He will be informed about the effect of different drugs on the human psyche 3. Will study behavior and personality disorders caused by drugs 4.
